BARBARA DEUTSCH - *Landscape Performance Series*

Barbara Deutsch, ASLA is the Executive Director of the Landscape Architecture Foundation (LAF), which is a philanthropic organization founded in 1966 by Ian McHarg and leading landscape architects of the time to increase the collective capacity of landscape architects to solve the "environmental crisis". Prior to LAF, Barbara worked on re-greening cities from Hong Kong to Washington, DC, serving most recently as a sustainability consultant for BioRegional to deliver Zero Carbon, Zero Waste, Net-Zero Water communities. She earned a BS in Commerce from the University of Virginia, a Masters in Landscape Architecture from the University of Washington, and was awarded a Loeb Fellowship at the Harvard Graduate School of Design in 2006.

DAVIS RHORER - *Public Investment in Downtown Results in Private Investment*

As Executive Director of the Downtown Development District, Davis Rhorer is responsible for carrying out the mission of the DDD to initiate, incubate and support partnerships that develop and enhance Downtown Baton Rouge. In this capacity, Rhorer has worked closely with the DDD Board of Directors, private sector partners and local government to revitalize Louisiana's Capitol City, helping to attract more than \$2.4 billion in investments over the last 20 years.

Since the DDD was established in 1987, Rhorer has served as a leader in the development of various plans and initiatives that have transformed the Downtown area, including: the Baton Rouge 2000 Plan, Baton Rouge 2000 Update, the Riverfront Development Plan, the Fourth Street Master Plan, the Capitol Park Master Plan, the New River District Master Plan, the Downtown Visitors' Amenity Plan and the city's comprehensive Master Plan for development, Plan Baton Rouge. He also played a key role in Phase II of Plan Baton Rouge and in the FuturEBR Comprehensive Plan for the City-Parish. In this capacity, Rhorer was recently elected to serve on the International Downtown Association board and currently serves as an Executive Board Member of the Big River Economic and Agricultural Development Alliance (BREDA), the organization that directs the Farmer's Market and the Main Street Market. He is also a member of the Rotary Club of Baton Rouge, the East Baton Rouge Metropolitan Council's Historic Preservation Commission, the Capitol House Taxing District, River Park Taxing District, Hotel King Taxing District and the Mayor-President's Smart Growth Task Force.

Jim Laiche received his BS in Horticulture and Master's degree in Landscape Architecture from Louisiana State University. He has worked professionally as a landscape architect and design-build contractor prior to working with The Toro Company.
